Mount Sinai Hospital is a 291-staffed bed teaching hospital that provides medical, surgical, behavioral health, therapeutic and diagnostic services.

Sinai continues to focus on the needs of its communities, now largely Latino and African American, and strives to achieve the vision of becoming a national model for the delivery of urban healthcare.

Sinai ranks among the top 10 percent of hospitals nationwide in 75 percent of national hospital quality measures. By adhering to these standardized measures, Sinai physicians and caregivers provide consistent, high quality medical care, patient safety and better outcomes.

At-a-glance

- Level I Trauma Center for adult and pediatric emergencies — highest level of care (one of only four designated trauma centers in Chicago)
- Second highest number of births in the city of Chicago
- Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Center — highest level of care for fragile newborns
- Pediatric Intensive Care Unit — specialized care for children with serious or life-threatening injuries or illnesses
- Sinai Children's Hospital includes pediatric cardiology, gastroenterology, nephrology, allergy, hematology, endocrinology and neurology

- Nearly 500 physicians on staff and more than 200 employed specialists
- Specialty services include Cardiovascular Services, Cancer Care Center, Stroke Center, Orthopedics, Minimally Invasive Surgery, Diabetes, Geriatrics and more
- Cardiology and cardiovascular surgery services include cardiac catheterization, non-invasive and invasive cardiac testing (coronary angiography, electrophysiology studies), coronary artery bypass surgery, heart valve repair and replacement
- Comprehensive Cancer Care Center provides integrated services to patients, including diagnosis and staging, genetic testing, pathology, surgical and non-surgical treatment, chemotherapy, radiation, inpatient treatment, interventional radiology oncology, gynecology, pain management, support services, clinical trials and oncology rehabilitation
- Inpatient and outpatient behavioral health
- Advanced imaging technology includes 1.5T MRI, digital mammography, 64-slice CT
- Major teaching hospital that trains more than 700 health care professionals through undergraduate, graduate, residency and fellowship programs
- Sinai Interpreter Services, Deaf Access Program and Illinois Video Interpreter Network (IVIN) make health-related communications available 24/7 for foreign language-speaking patients and Deaf or hard of hearing patients
